Capital Works and UPAR Update: August 22, 2016

108th Street – 10th to 11th Avenue

Asphalt milling and preparations for paving will be completed shortly, with paving planned for early this week as well as boulevard landscaping. Road closures and access disruptions will be in effect while the work is underway.

St. Laurent Drive – Douglas to McKenzie King Crescent

Final paving is complete.

102nd Street – 16th to 17th Avenue

Roadway restoration work has begun with the construction of the structural granular courses. Concrete work is expected to begin this week, with final paving to follow. This block is open to local traffic, but will be subject to complete closures once work resumes on the roadway.

106th Street 10th to 11th Avenue

The road is closed, and underground work is complete. Rain over the last couple of weeks has delayed backfilling and cleanup work. Roadway restoration work is planned to begin this week, with street lights, concrete curbs and sidewalks, and paving to follow in the coming weeks. The local drinking water advisory for this block has been lifted.

96th Street – Railway Avenue to 14th Avenue

Underground work on the 1200 block is expected to be completed this week. The 1200 block will remain on a local drinking water advisory, and the 1300 block will be connected to temporary water supply and also be placed on a local drinking water advisory. The 1300 block will be closed this week as the underground work proceeds northward.

97th Street – Railway Avenue to 13th Avenue

Underground work is expected to start early in September.

Territorial Drive Pathway Paving – Douglas Ave to 15th Avenue

The pathway paving is complete.

City Hall South Parking Lot Paving

The parking lot has been paved, and will reopen Tuesday, once the line painting is complete.

Buhler Avenue Paving

Buhler Avenue, east of Clements Drive is planned to be paved this week.
