

The following materials are acceptable at the Household Hazardous Waste Day:

Adhesives - contact cement, caulking, sealer, carpet and linoleum adhesives, glue

Aerosols - hair spray, insect repellent, lubricant spray, furniture cleaner

Automotive - carburetor cleaners, oil fuel

Cleaners - oven cleaner, toilet bowl cleaner, glass cleaner, spot remover, disinfectants, car wax

Corrosives - drain cleaner, engine degreaser, ammonia, battery acid, sulfuric acid

Fuels - gasoline, diesel, kerosene, lamp oil, oil/gas mixture

Mercury - mercury, thermometers

Oxidizers - chlorine, bleach, pool chemicals, fertilizers, hydrogen peroxide, septic tank chemicals

Poisons - lawn herbicides, garden chemicals, rat poison, gopher killer, insecticides

Solvents - paint thinner, acetone, varsol, alcohol, benzene, xylene, naphtha

*The above should be in original container or clearly labelled.

Electronics - Electronics are not accepted by GFL at Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off Days. Please see [SARCAN's Saskatchewan Waste Electronic Equipment Program \(SWEEP\)](#)

Batteries (no charge)

- Automotive or other large lead acid batteries – take to Waste Management Facility
- cellphone, rechargeable, watch or hearing aid – drop off at City Hall
- alkaline – can be disposed of in garbage, taken to City Hall or Waste Management Facility

Used oil/antifreeze, oil filters – take to Waste Management Facility (No charge)

Propane Cylinders - barbeque cylinders, camp cylinders – take to Waste Management Facility (recyclable material charge applies). These present a safety hazard to employees if disposed of in the roll out carts.

Fluorescent Bulbs and Ballasts – take to Waste Management Facility

Mercury - mercury thermostats – drop off at City Hall

Medications – check if your local pharmacy participates in a Medication Return Program
