Online Registration now available for Community Safety Programs

Under the Community Safety Strategy umbrella, the City of North Battleford offers several programs that encourage residents and businesses to actively help make the community safer. To ease the process of joining these programs, the City now offers Online registration for the Battlefords Citizens on Patrol Program, the Eyes That Care Initiative, and the Security Camera Registry.

“We always look for ways to improve our Customer Service and make it easier for the community to join our initiatives”, says City Manager Jim Puffalt. “They now have the opportunity to register for these programs from the convenience of their computer or mobile devices. We hope this improvement will encourage more people to participate.”

The option to download and print registration forms or to fill out forms at City Hall will remain.

About the programs

Eyes That Care: This initiative empowers residents who want to address the preventable crime challenges that North Battleford is facing. In exchange for residents committing to this project, the City provides a solar motion sensor light thanks to support of Canadian Tire and an Eyes That Care sign to be displayed in the front window. The ultimate goal is to reduce preventable crimes such as vehicle thefts and residential

break-ins by 10%. As of February 2018, over 140 residents have signed up for the Program.

Battlefords Citizens on Patrol: In this program, concerned residents, business owners or operators volunteer their time to assist RCMP in identifying suspicious activity or crime in progress, and reporting that information to the RCMP. As of January 2018, 20 members have joined the Program.

Security Camera Registry: Business owners and residents in the Battlefords area can help protect the community by registering the location of their security camera(s). The information will be shared with the RCMP and Community Safety Officers and will remain confidential. Should an incident occur in the area, RCMP or CSOs may contact the owner to view security footage. As of January 2018, there are 15 security cameras registered.
